The Turtles

Formed in Los Angeles in 1963, the Turtles underwent a series of name changes before registering their first hit single as folk rockers in 1965 with a version of Bob Dylan's "It Ain't Me Babe.

The single replaced the Beatles' "Penny Lane" at number one on the Billboard Hot 100 in the spring of 1967. The Turtles' only No. 1 remained there for three weeks.

The band's core, vocalists Volman and Kaylan, continued as Flo (the Phlorescent Leech) and Eddie after the Turtles' dissolution in 1970, working with Frank Zappa, providing backup vocals for other performers and recording and performing on their own.

The original members were Howard Kaylan, Mark Volman, Al Nichol, Chuck Portz and Don Murray.

The Turtles was an American band popular in the mid-1960s that specialized in vocally rich, craftily arranged pop music.

"Happy Together" (1967) was their biggest hit.
